#### Will I receive photo credit?

Absolutely! Each photo used will be appropriately credited with your name.

## How should I submit my photos?

First, save your photo by naming it with the subject, where the photo was taken (county or wildlife management area name), and the name you wish to be credited by.

Example: File name = AgField\_DoolyCounty\_AubreyMartin; BlackbelliedDucks\_AltamahaWMA\_MarkWhitney

To upload your photos, visit the GNPA submission link: <a href="http://bit.ly/2Ekm7LR">http://bit.ly/2Ekm7LR</a>. This is an unlisted gallery so that your photos remain protected and is only accessible to Georgia DNR public affairs staff. You can upload more than one photo at a time. Once your photo is



uploaded, you will not be able to see it or make edits. The submission was successful if you receive the "Hooray!" screen.

PNG is best, but a JPG would be fine too. Please upload your photo at the highest quality resolution you have available.

- Opossum
- Alligators
- Red-cockaded Woodpecker
- Salamanders (all species)
- Snakes (all species)
